

Community Practitioner Nurse or Midwife Prescriber – V150

This module aims to prepare nurses or midwives to prescribe safely, appropriately and cost-effectively from the Nurse Prescribers Formulary for Community Practitioners. Following successful completion of the module you will be able to competently and confidently write prescriptions in accordance with the nurse prescribing formulary for patients who you have personally assessed their care.

Key taught areas include: Professional accountability in terms of prescribing practice, legal aspects of prescribing, clinical pharmacology, critical reasoning skills, clinical judgement and decision making, numeracy, reflective learning, prescribing in a team context.

Entry criteria The applicant is...

- A registered level one nurse or qualified practitioner working in an area of clinical need for which prescribing will improve patient care and service delivery.
- In order to apply for the level 6 programme, you must be capable of studying at degree level.
- In order to apply for the level 7 programme, you must already have a first degree and be capable of studying masters level.
- Competent to take a history, undertake a clinical assessment and arrive at a nursing diagnosis.
- Required to secure the support of your manager and have been allocated a prescribing Practise Assessor (PA) and a Practice Supervisor (PS) for the duration of the programme. The PA and PS must attend a programme specific information session.
- All applicants will be required to undertake a selection interview prior to being offered a place on the programme. Closing date for applications will be two weeks before the programmes starts.

Funding:

- Funding is available via HEIW on a first come first served basis.

There is a maximum of 25 students per cohort. Funding will be allocated following accurate completion of application forms.

The applicant will...

- Have sufficient knowledge to be able to apply the prescribing principles to their own practice setting.
- Demonstrate appropriate numeracy skills at time of entry into the module.
- Have support from their employer to undertake 100% of the module
- Be required to undertake a selection interview prior to being offered a place on the programme. Closing date for applications will be two weeks before the programmes starts.
