Regardless of the fee level, we will:

- Write to all students applying for entry each year to notify them of the fees, the arrangements for paying fees and the support available to them.
- We will provide information on fee levels for each year of the programme of study (in order to calculate the aggregate fee for the entire programme).
- We will also write to students applying to Swansea University for deferred entry from the previous year to notify them of the fees.
- We will also write to current students who may be affected by fee changes if they choose to move to another course or have to re-sit to provide them with the appropriate information.
- We will also write to prospective and current students as soon as is practically possible to notify them of any fee changes as determined by the Welsh Government (such as future fee increases linked to inflation).
