Paid Internship Opportunities for Swansea University Postgraduate students in English Literature and Creative Writing

The 'Words that Burn' project is an exciting initiative focusing on Human Rights education for Key Stage 3 pupils. Led by Dr Elaine Canning of Swansea University's Cultural Institute, it is part of a major programme of **DylanED*** outreach activities generously funded by the Rhys Davies Trust in collaboration with Amnesty International UK (AIUK). The project aims to empower young people to learn about human rights and feel valued as poets and change makers.

***DylanED**, the educational strand of the Swansea University Dylan Thomas Prize, is a growing programme of community investment that seeks to inspire young people to engage with literature and develop their own creative voices.

Placement Details, Duties and Responsbilities

We are offering six paid placement opportunities for postgraduate students to deliver a series of workshops for schools in South Wales at Key Stage 3.

- Students will be supported to develop an understanding of human rights for delivering classroom-based poetry workshops by attending training delivered by AIUK and Swansea University's Cultural Institute.
- Each student will deliver 4 x 1-hour workshops for their designated school between February and April 2025.
- Students will participate in a showcase event featuring the work of pupils from their designated schools on Tuesday 13th May 2025.
